#### **Public Examination and Results**

As per our academic schedule, this year our students appeared for their school final exam. The exam started on the 5th May 2022 and ended on the 31st May 2022. In the 12th standard, 99 students from our school appeared for the examination, 1 student was absent. Our school scored 100%.

The first mark claimed by Ms. Rithika got 541 out of 600. And second Mr Keerthivasan 524/500 and the third mark was by Ms. Kavya 516/600.

In the 10th standard public examination, 82 students appeared, 11 students failed and 71 students came out with flying colours. The highest mark was obtained by Ms. Yuvasri 380/500. We will concentrate on the failing students to get through the examination in their next attempt. At this moment, I sincerely thank you for all your support and prayers and also thank our teachers and our management.

For the new academic year around 750 students across various villages of the district are present this year.

Dear friends and Benefactors,



Prayerful Greetings from Rajesh, studying in 8th standard, and Rakesh studying in 6th standard in Dr. R. Arulappa Higher Secondary school.

My father Shankar has not stepped into school and my mother Kamatchi has studied 5<sup>th</sup> standard. I have an elder sister who failed in the 10th standard. My parents are coolie (daily wages) workers. We are from Agili village. We belong to the Scheduled Tribe (Irular) - a socially, economically and politically deprived community. There are nearly 50 families in my village. It is painful to say that still in our village there is

no power and water supply. We use oil lamps and we go for water nearby. In our community, many people do not study as our family and social structure do not allow us. One of the social workers who work for our community came to know about St John's home through a friend and he admitted us to our St John's home. Rev Fr Davidnesan tried to take some of the students from my village to give good education in our school. But they didn't respond to his request and we responded to him. Some of them said they would like to study in government schools. We feel delighted here and we get a new atmosphere especially studying under the lights and we get good water for drinking and other purposes which our people still could not get. We are really amazed looking at such a huge school with many facilities which we didn't get in our previous school. We are very happy and sincerely thank our beloved correspondent and lovable sister Nandhini Krishnan who always gives their utmost care to all the children in our hostel. The wardens are also good to us and they give their valuable time for our better future. We also thank all good hearts who support our institutions. Take care and thank you all.

John Suresh and Nandhini Krishnan Akka came to our village. Rev. Fr. John Suresh not only took our village's

problem but also made all the children not only complete school education but he made us all graduates by studying in various universities. Before Rev Fr John Suresh came to our village my father was grazing cows, buffaloes, and oxen in a high caste people's house like

a slave but after our village struggle, my father became a Mason because of the opportunity provided by Rev Fr John Suresh and Nandhini Akka. I studied till 8th standard and at that time our village struggle started and Rev. Fr John Suresh took all of us those who completed 8th standard and we were put in Dr. R Arulappa Higher secondary school and helped us to complete the school education. And then through the WE group, he helped us to get graduation. I completed my graduation in B. Com, (Bachelor of Commerce) Vidhya Sagar College. At present, I am working as an HR assistant in A V Thomas Leather and Allied Private Ltd. I earn enough to run my family. I have a daughter and I have a house of my own. At this moment I sincerely remember and thank Rev Fr John Suresh, Nandhini Akka, and especially our loving Pappa Dr Johannes Mispagel and other European friends who helped me in my growth. I am ever grateful to our WE group. Thank you.
