Dr. Arulappa Higher Secondary School, Neerpair



Medical Camp:

A medical camp was organized in collaboration with Primary Health Care, Nallamur, specifically for the 12th standard students. This camp focused on general health checkups and well-being, aiming to address key health concerns. It is part of an ongoing initiative, with plans to conduct similar camps on a monthly basis to ensure the consistent health monitoring of our students.

Teachers Orientation Program:

On August 24th, a comprehensive Teachers Orientation Program was organized for



the staff of Dr. Arulappa Higher Secondary School at the National Shrine of St. Thomas Mount, under the guidance of Rev Fr. Michael Thomas. The program offered valuable insights, practical approaches, and innovative teaching strategies aimed at enhancing student engagement and fostering a more dynamic and effective learning environment. The session equipped teachers with tools to enrich their educational methods, ensuring

Distribution of Bicycles:

Social Issues in India:

In this newsletter, I would like to highlight some pressing social issues currently affecting vulnerable communities in India. On August 9th, a tragic incident occurred in Kolkata (West Bengal), where a 31-year-old trainee woman doctor was brutally raped and murdered at R.G. Kar Medical College and Hospital. A civic volunteer, Sanjay Roy, has been arrested and charged in connection with this heinous crime.

This case has ignited widespread protests within the medical community in West Bengal, with doctors

demanding justice and advocating for enhanced workplace safety in hospitals. In response, junior doctors across the state have initiated hunger strikes, calling for immediate action from authorities.

The urgency of this situation cannot be overstated; it has sparked a nationwide conversation about the need for reforms in hospital security and accountability. As protests escalate, numerous doctors from various hospitals have voiced their discontent, leading to the resignation of senior doctors from several institutions.

This case remains a significant point of contention, reflecting broader issues of safety and justice for women in India. It is imperative that we address these concerns and work towards creating a safer environment for all.
