Success storyMy Dear friends,



75th Constitution Day - India



In India, from beginning as mere traders to eventually ruling all of India, the English employed a series of harsh and exploitative measures to seize the country's wealth and dominate its people. However, the relentless freedom struggle, which gained momentum in the late 19th century, ultimately culminated in India's independence in 1947. The journey from seeking dominion status to achieving complete independence was marked by continuous and determined efforts by freedom fighters against British Crown rule.

As the fight for independence intensified, the British proposed that India drafts its own constitution. Recognizing the enormity of the task, they suggested Dr. B.R. Ambedkar, a distinguished economist, jurist, social reformer, and political visionary, as the ideal candidate to lead this monumental effort. In line with the British Cabinet Mission Plan of 1946, the Constituent Assembly was formed to draft the Constitution of India. Dr. Ambedkar, as the Chairman of the Drafting Committee, played a pivotal role in shaping the document that would define the nation's democratic framework. Over a period of 2 years and 11 months, the Assembly held 11 exhaustive sessions to discuss and finalize the draft constitution.

Dr. Ambedkar was deeply committed to uplifting marginalized communities, including the Scheduled Castes (SCs), Scheduled Tribes (STs), and Other Backward Classes (OBCs). He believed that true equality could only be achieved by incorporating special provisions for these communities within the constitution. Through his vision, he ensured that the document upheld social justice, individual dignity, and equality for all citizens. On November 26, 1949, the fully drafted Indian Constitution was formally adopted—a momentous occasion now celebrated as Constitution Day across the nation. This living document has empowered generations of Indians with rights, freedoms, and the promise of equality.

As we mark the 75th anniversary of the Indian Constitution this year, I feel immense pride and gratitude for Dr. B.R. Ambedkar, whose foresight and tireless efforts granted us the privilege of living with dignity under a framework that protects and uplifts us all. Today, we honour his legacy with a heartfelt salute, acknowledging that we stand tall because he laid the foundation for a just and equitable India. I feel immense joy and pride in proclaiming to the world that we stand here today with dignity and equality because he was there to lay the foundation by framing our Constitution.

Christmas is a season of joy, love, and togetherness – a time that unites families, friends, and



loved ones near and far. It brings not only happiness but also a heartfelt opportunity to remember and reach out to those dear to us, even if we cannot be with them in person.
